
YELLOW is the color of sunshine. Bright pure yellow is an attention grabber and is a symbol of joy. But is has been said babies cry more in yellow rooms.









IRVING PENN


Centennial

at the met fifth avenue April 24-July 30th 2017



The most comprehensive retrospective to date of the work of the great American photographer Irving Penn (1917–2009), this exhibition marks the centennial of the artist's birth. Over the course of his nearly 70-year career, Penn mastered a pared-down aesthetic of studio photography that is distinguished for its meticulous attention to composition, nuance, and detail. The exhibition follows the 2015 announcement of the landmark promised gift from The Irving Penn Foundation to The Met of more than 150 photographs by Penn, representing every period of the artist's dynamic career with the camera. The gift forms the core of the exhibition, which features more than 200 photographs by Penn, including iconic fashion studies of Lisa Fonssagrives-Penn, the artist's wife; exquisite still lifes; Quechua children in Cuzco, Peru; portraits of urban laborers; female nudes; tribesmen in New Guinea; and color flower studies. The artist's beloved portraits of cultural figures from Truman Capote, Picasso, and Colette to Ingmar Bergman and Issey Miyake are also featured. 

In the city that never sleeps, with over 8 million stories to tell, there's a company that enjoys the strange and out of ordinary things in life. "We saw where reality TV was going, and we like twisting things around. We like to put a twist on certain storylines -hence our company name, Twisted Media NYC."

Sandy Foley of Fashion Haunts magazine had the opportunity to sit down with Twisted Media NYC founder and President, John Harrison in a one-on-one interview at one of New York's renown Irish American pubs, John Sullivan's on 35th street.

Sandy: First of all, thank you for having us over. So tell us, how did Twisted Media NYC get its start? Where did it all begin?

John: Twisted Media NYC started through our sports and media connections. We became involved with world famous sports teams. We put together a strategic plan for our client's web based content to be broadcast in Asia.

Both myself and business partner James Dalton were looking at current media and programming platforms to add our own 'twist' to a project under development. We are always looking at ways of twisting an idea and concept.

Sandy: What sports and media connections do you have? And how did you get into film?

John: We worked with many famous professionals in sports, movies, music, and entertainment industries for over 10 years. We respectfully withhold their names -but they know who we are.

One day we were approached by an agent asking for help in seeking funding for multiple movie projects. Through my vast list of business connections, I was able to connect various movie projects ranging from Christian faith based movies to biopics with financial institutions.

Sandy: Tell us about some of the projects you're currently working on.

John: We recently created a new reality show called UnReal Estate. There are paranormal shows and real estate shows out there. We merged and twisted them calling it UnReal Estate which brings the quirky side of New York City apartments. People are looking for certain kind of apartments, so when our clients sense a presence in their property, we'll bring in your paranormal ghost hunting team to give the place a once over.

Sandy: What kind of requests do some people have?

John: Well, it's the dark, dark side of New York City. There's people out there that would like to have a casket in their apartment and actually sleep in them! They think they're vampires. They dress like vampires. And they don't come out during the day. Some even hang upside down in their closet. It's all part of the strange and quirky side of

New York. So we crossover the Real Estate side of things, most people know it as it as squeaky clean, to the paranormal side which is a side I tend to steer away from. But after speaking with you, I've been enlightened that it's not that scary after all.

Sandy: Our team likes to go head-on with the paranormal.

John: I feel comfortable enough now to achieve our goals and work together to bring real case studies to the TV about people who actually believe they are a vampire, lykon, or whatever, and truly think their property is possessed.

Sandy: Besides UnReal Estate, are there other projects you're currently working on?

John: We have a new project called Rock Chefs. We invite famous classic Rockers who are trying to re-brand themselves and enjoy cooking, to cook on our show and talk about their experiences from their tours, the foods they eaten, and recreate that environment with a famous chef.

Sandy: At Fashion Haunts, we love classic rock. That would be awesome to watch! Are there any movie projects you have going on?

John: We're involved with Bungalow 42 Productions out of Los Angeles that is doing a movie about Marilyn Monroe. It's called Goodnight Marilyn. It's about the ongoing investigation of her death, what really happened, and her final hours of her life. We believe in this project, and we're putting together investors to help complete this project. I know that no matter what they discover, her legend will live on.


Sandy: You seem to have a lot of projects going on. Where can people find you and get more information?

This is where he started his modelling career, even getting the nicknames, Runway or Hollywood, from his fellow police officers. He modeled with the Ruth Barnes Modelling Agency and did numerous runway shows in Canada, as well as commercial photo shoots. Following acting lessons, he got the role of a police officer in a television pilot.

KINNELON CASTLE -A Haunted Fashion Rendevous by Aki Solomos

Nestled in north New Jersey, where the I-287 and Route 23 meet, is a borough called Kinnelon. And within those 19 square miles, many manors and mansions were built in the early 1900's. Among them, on a 9-acre property, New York stockbroker Milton Untermeyer built his stone mansion in 1920. Mirroring the French provincial castles, Milton imported European cut stones, tiles, and marble. To accentuate the property, he surrounded his new home with various exotic plants and trees.

One can imagine the glamour and opulence of the roaring 20's -when the wealthy such as the Astors, Vanderbilts, Getty, and Carnegie lived like royalty. Their homes were palaces. Quick excursions to their summer cottages/mansions, and house parties were a common thing to do if you were successful. Jazz bands played their instruments; women showed off their moves in their fringed dresses and pearls; and men enjoyed their drinks and stogies in their sharp suits and top hats. 'The Great Gatsby' days.

Nearly five decades later, 1968 to be exact, Kinnelon Castle, or the Untermeyer Mansion, burned down to the ground. Not much of it was left except the remnants of its imposing stone walls and steps, and a couple of fireplaces with their chimneys. According to its new owner, Jeffrey Konarski, a lightning strike was the cause of the fire. His family bought the property in 1998, and hidden from sight, high atop a hill, camouflaged by ivy, thick brush, and trees, the forgotten castle was rediscovered.

"There's some rich history here. In the 1920's, someone was murdered at a dinner party. And the History Channel filmed here about the war. The place used to be amazing during its heyday. It was like a cathedral!" During the lost years, rumors and tales spread throughout the neighborhood of wandering ghosts, of students being chased by a shotgun wielding figure, and even an old lady living among the ruins. Each story differed, adding flair and mystery to Kinnelon Castle.

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A Model Citizen

Nana is one of the most entertaining cast members in the history of Always Late TV's Local Ambition web series, but she has overcome a lot to get there.

From an early age, Nana knew that she had to be strong in order to survive. Not knowing who her father was, Nana lived with her mother in an abusive household until she was 13. At that point, her mother kicked her out and she spent several years living on the streets of St. Louis. While she was homeless, she would look at the tall skyscrapers and city lights and dream of a better future. Nana says that the time she spent on the streets made St. Louis "part of her soul."

Eventually, her mother would find her and sent her to a juvenile rehabilitation center for troubled teens. Having never committed a crime, Nana had to adjust to living with teenagers who had been in trouble with the law. Scheduled meal times, curfews, and counseling sessions became a regular part of Nana's life.

When her time at the rehabilitation center was over, Nana was picked up by the relative of a friend she met at the center. "I took the wrong ride," she said, recalling the events that took place after she was picked up. What was a simple ride home turned into a kidnapping. She did everything she could to escape another abusive environment and found safety in the streets of St. Louis once again. Nana said, "I never got the love I deserved growing up." As an adult, Nana was finally introduced to her father - whom she had not seen her entire life. "He lived in a house right around the area I slept in when I was homeless," she said. She is also living with her boyfriend, Loafer, in a home in the Forest Park area of St. Louis.

Throughout her life, Nana was always misunderstood and wanted to find an outlet for her creativity. This year, she found an ad online for the casting call for Local Ambition's sixth season. She showed up and the producers fell in love with her and were touched by her story.

Always Late TV's web series, Local Ambition, features 11 women who go head-to-head in a series of themed photo shoots and modeling challenges. Unlike other shows of the genre, Local Ambition, casts women of different shapes, sizes, ages, and backgrounds defying mainstream modeling's vision of what a model should be. The focus of the show is not on outward appearances, but rather characters, personalities, and stories. Each of the eleven cast members in the current season have a story to tell. Viewers will find out who they are and how they got there. They will also discover how the cast reacts when they have to be competitive toward one another.

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Cooking with Chef Sal

Roasted Hot Sausage over Sautéed Broccoli Rabe with Roasted Potatoes

2-3 bunches of broccoli rabe

5 tablespoons extra virgin olive oil

1 Clove of garlic

2 lbs. packages of Hot Sausage links

Crushed red peppers

3 lbs. of red potatoes

Salt pepper to taste

Rosemary

Oregano

Pre-heat oven to 350

Lay sausage in baking pan, coat pan with oil

Put sausages in oven for 30 minutes turn once to cook evenly

Prepare broccoli to boil, by cutting off a inch of the ends In a large pot, boil broccoli with a touch of salt in water Boil for 5 minutes

Cool down broccoli by putting on ice, then take out of water to squeeze out excess water. Put to side

Clean potatoes and cut in quarters, lay potatoes on oil covered baking pan

Cover potatoes with salt, pepper and sprinkle chopped garlic, rosemary and oregano on top

Place in oven and bake 30 to 40 minutes

Take sautee pan let it get hot then ad oil, add 2 Tbls. of chopped garlic, cook. As garlic is browning add a Tsp. of crushed red pepper. Add Broccoli rabe and saute

Add salt and pepper to broccoli to taste

Cook until tender, not too soft

When ready place the broccoli rabe on large plate then layer sausage criss-cross on top of broccoli rabe

Take roasted red peppers and use for decoration on plate Add small roasted potatoes and place on the four corners of plate or serve on seperate plate

Place on on table and Enjoy!
